Topic: Mathematics Study Guidelines

Message Objective(s):

1. Assist learners to score higher marks in Mathematics.
2. Encourage learners to identify their strengths and weaknesses and take appropriate action.

Message:

Time flies and the Final Examinations are just around the corner! Let me take this opportunity to remind you about the 2, 3 hours exam papers coming. Paper 1 topics include Algebraic expressions, equations, and inequalities (25), Number patterns (25), Functions and Graphs (35), Finance, Growth and Decay (15), Differential Calculus (35), Counting principles and probability (15 marks).

Paper 2 topics include Euclidian geometry (40), Analytical geometry (40), Trigonometry (50) and Statistics (20 marks).

Having listed the topics above, the learners need to rank them from the topic that one is very good at to the most difficult one. There is a tendency of studying and spending more time on easier topics whenever study time comes. I therefore recommend that learners start working on those topics which they feel are challenging now so that by the time exams come, they will be able to answer questions correctly. Seek extra tuition in those 'difficult' topics until you are good at each and move to the next.

Woza Matrics platform is now open and TV viewing schedules are out too, which is normally from 2300hrs to 0600hrs. Learners can access missed video lessons on TV and from the YouTube Woza Matrics platform. Other revision materials can be downloaded on NECT website under materials.
