Topic: Direct Speech

Message Objectives: Learners will be able to define the direct speech.

Learners will be able to use inverted commas correctly.

Message: Direct speech is a sentence where the exact words that are spoken are written in **inverted** commas "".

How should direct speech be punctuated?

- When you are writing, inverted commas go before and after any words that a character says.
- Begin the sentence with opening inverted commas.
- Write only the words that are being said.
- Any punctuation goes **inside** the inverted commas.
- Close with inverted commas.
- If another character replies, do the following:
 - o use another set of inverted commas
 - o put the new person speaking on a new line e.g.

"I'm hungry," said the boy.

"Make yourself a sandwich," said his mum.
